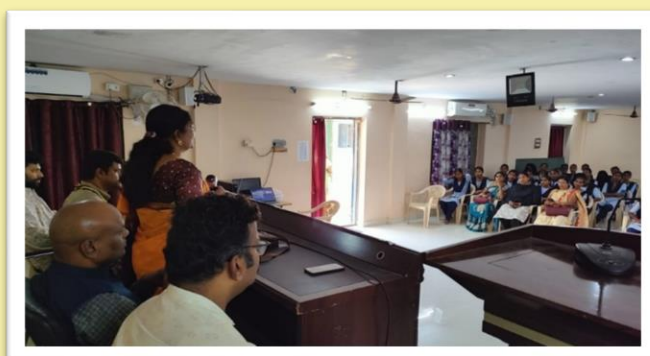


WORK SHOP ON “EFFECTIVE PUBLIC SPEAKING”
