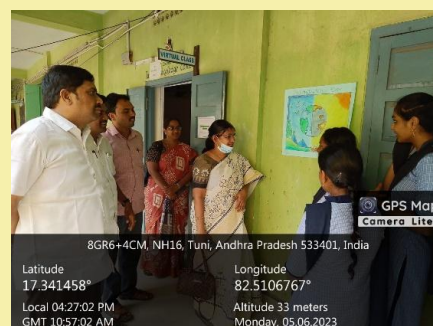
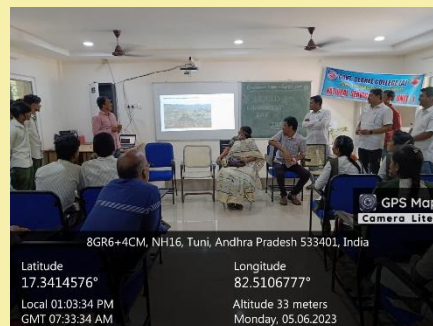
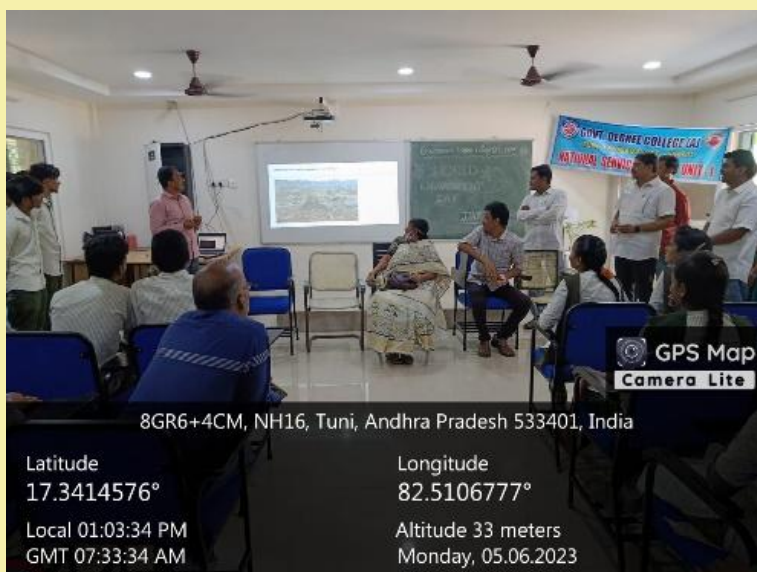
Department of chemistry and Botany

This year marks the 50th anniversary of World Environment Day, which focused on solution to plastic pollution. In 1972, the UN General Assembly announced **5 June** as **World Environment Day (WED)**. The first celebration, under the slogan “**Only One Earth**” took place in 1973.

On the eve of WED, department of Chemistry and Botany organised an awareness programme in which Principal, Vice Principal and different Department Heads attended and threw light on environmental Problems and Solutions. Poster presentation and plantation programme was conducted by departments.

World Day against Child labour

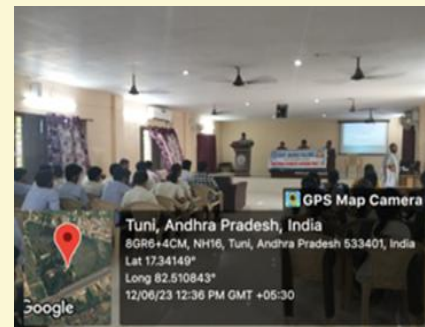
NSS and Department of Economics

Department of Physical Education

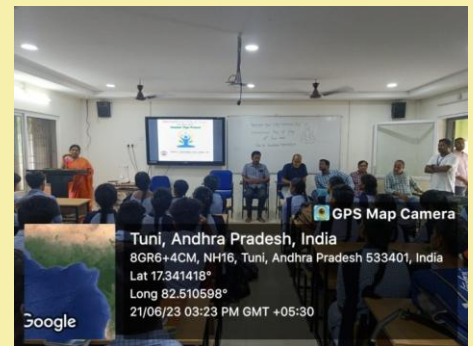
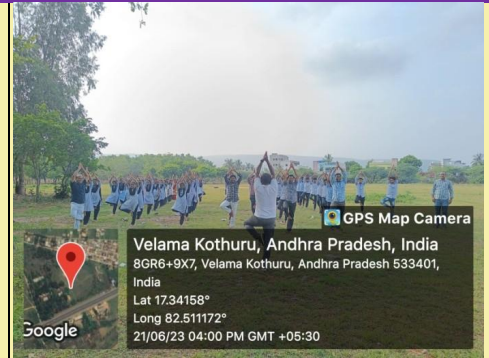
Theme: **Yoga for Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam**” One Earth, One Family, One Future.”

In his speech, Modi termed Yoga as an 'invaluable gift of India's ancient tradition' and highlighted the importance of yoga for maintaining 'Harmony between man and nature'. The draft resolution passed by India was backed by 177 nations and the first International Yoga Day was celebrated on June 21, 2015.

National Statistics Day

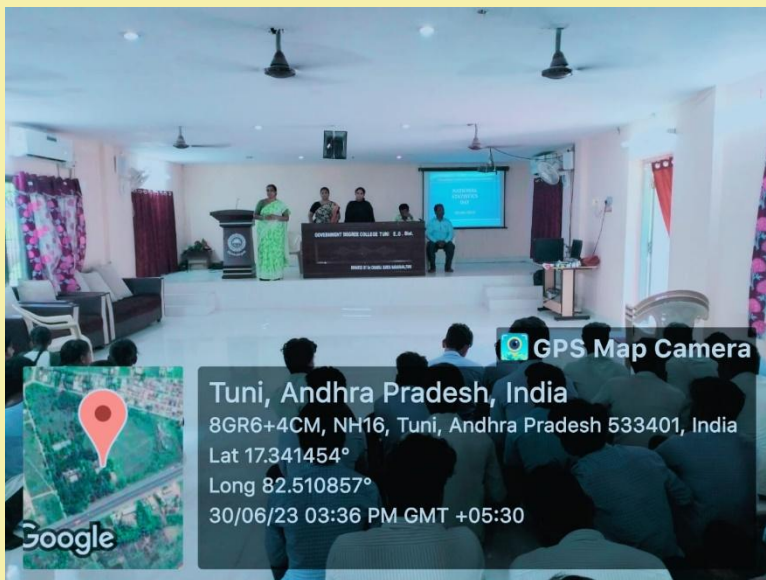
Department of Mathematics and department of Economics

Father, Professor P.C.Mahalanobis.

National Statistics Day is celebrated every year to recognize the contributions of Professor Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis in the fields of statistics and economic planning since 2007. He is also known as ‘Father of Indian Statistics’. He developed the Mahalanobis distance, a statistical measure used to determine the disparity between a point and distribution. He is the builder of the Indian Statistical Institution and an architect of the Second Five year plan. The students of B.A. explained the importance of statistics in all the fields and the history of Mahalanobis. The Departments conducted the online quiz through google forms on National Statistics. eighty students participated in this programme. 24 students participated in online quiz.
