About us:

Government Degree College came into existence in 1980 which was initially affiliated to Andhra University with B.A. & B.Com Sections. Introduced Science sections in 1988 and got UGC -2(f) & 12 B recognition in 1988. Catering the educational needs of around 1000 students from the economically marginalized sections of the rural areas.

Since 2012, the college has been affiliated with Adi Kavi Nanayya University. The college offers a diverse range of programs catering to various disciplines. There are 12 departments encompassing conventional and restructured undergraduate programs, along with a postgraduate program. In its pursuit of academic excellence, the college achieved autonomous status in 2017.

In 2017, three restructured science programs B.Sc. Maths, Chemistry, Computer Science; B.Sc. Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science; and B.Com. Computer Applications were introduced. Meeting the growing interest in Life Sciences, a conventional B.Sc. Botany, Zoology, Chemistry program was added in 2018. Further catering to regional demands, B. Voc. Pharmaceutical Chemistry and B.Com. Accounting & Taxation programs were introduced in 2020. The year 2021 saw the introduction of the restructured B.Sc. Mathematics, Physics, and Web technology program.

As per NEP- 2020 guidelines, our institution introduced 4 years UG Honors since 2023-24. Currently 9 Courses are running i.e. BA History, B.A. Political Science, B.com (General), B. Com (Computer application), B.Sc. (Chemistry, Organic chemistry, Botany, Mathematics and Computer Science)

The college boasts a sprawling campus of 22.14 acres with three academic blocks. Student friendly, well-furnished classrooms provide a conducive learning environment, while well-equipped laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science, and English support practical learning.

INTERNATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY

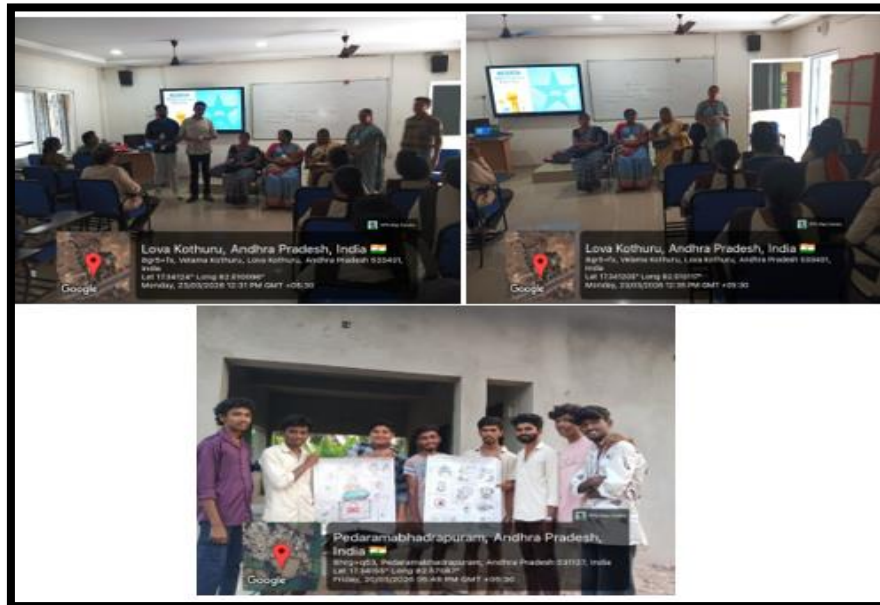

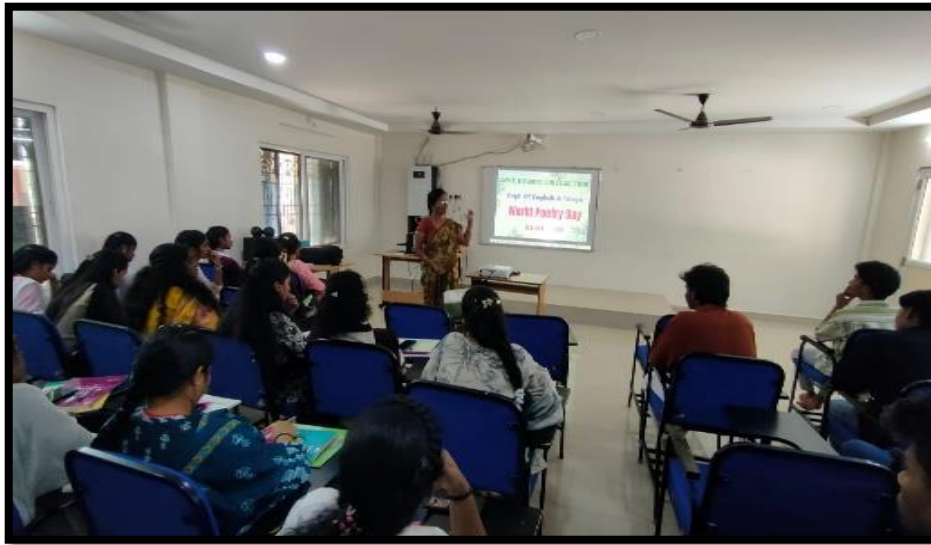
WORLD CONSUMER RIGHTS DAY

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND TELUGU



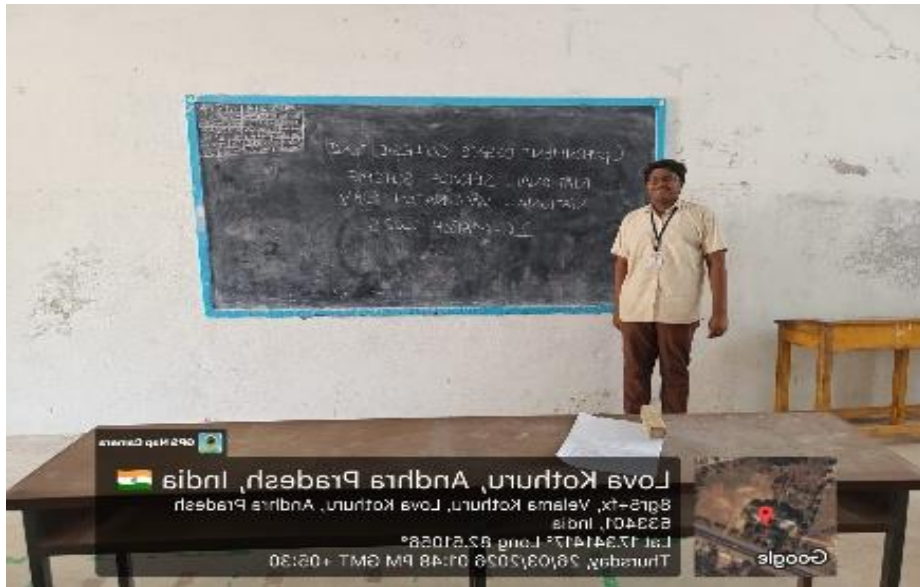

SASA REPORT – MARCH 2026



Swaccha Andra Swarna Andhra Theme for March, 2026 is **”Source segregation and Zero Waste lifestyles”**. The objective of the program is to promote responsible waste management practices among students and the community.

In this regard Our College conducted following activities

An **awareness program on “Plastic-Free Environment”** was organized by **G. Bharathi, Lecturer in Political Science**, who encouraged students to adopt eco-friendly alternatives such as steel bottles, cloth bags, and reusable materials. This initiative contributed to the vision of a **Zero Waste Campus**.

Practical steps were also taken to manage waste effectively:

Small composting units were set up to process food waste from the canteen and hostel, with the compost used for college gardens.

A **dustbin system** was introduced across the campus:

Green bins for wet, biodegradable waste (5 units)

Blue bins for dry/recyclable waste (1 unit)

Red bins for hazardous/biomedical waste (4 units)

Yellow/Black bins for specialized waste like infectious or general materials

The program also included a **debate session** on sustainable practices, followed by an **oath-taking ceremony**, where students pledged to adopt zero waste lifestyles and contribute to a cleaner environment.
