- Staff members are attending various Refresher/Orientation courses randomly or nominated by Commissionerate of Collegiate Education AP, Hyderabad for updating the existing knowledge.

- As per the schedule timetable given by CCE / Nannayya University, the institution follows the examination pattern.
- Assignments are conducted regularly, Unit exams once in a month and term examinations for every three months. Pre-final and Final Examinations are conducted as per the schedule.
- The valuation of the exams is done within a week and posted in the prescribed register in the given time.

To increase the research activities all the staff members are encouraged to apply for Minor/Major Research Projects. Faculty Development Programmes are pursuing Ph.D. in the concerned discipline as a career advancement in research. Efforts are going to involve student participation in research activities.

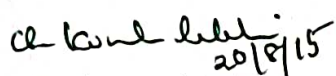
